Psychiatrist assesses all children upon admission and follows for chemotherapy as needed. The psychiatrist is also available to assess in emergency situations. The psychiatrist staffs with the treatment team members on a weekly basis. There is a 24hour on call schedule. Community medical providers are used.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Families are invited to attend admissions and be a part of the treatment team when deemed appropriate by social worker. The agency employs a parent advocate that assist parents who are moving through the system. Family therapy and home visits are a part of treatment plan on a case by case basis. Transportation for home visits is made available when possible. When possible and therapeutically indicated, siblings are placed together and/or given family therapy.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Case management is available to all children. There is 24-hour clinical on call coverage. Psychologicals and chemical dependency assessments are available on site. Chemical dependency treatment is available through individual therapy, IOP and after care groups.
