AGC also provides on site prenatal classes, parenting classes, substance abuse education, and mental health counseling. AGC also provides Independent Living classes and a transitional Independent Living Home. AGC acknowledges that learning and growth are a continuum of formal and informal experiences found all throughout life. It is the goal of this program to equip the mothers/children with as many foundational skills as possible and to improve the total quality of life for each mother and child.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

AGC attempts to assist significant persons and families in fully participating in the delivery of services and are informed about service options, setting and modifying service goals, and making decisions about the services they receive. Ongoing family participation is expected, unless contraindicated, and the organization communicates this expectation at the initial consultation or at intake. In cases of reunification, a family-centered service plan that identifies the family's unmet service needs; plans for maintaining or strengthening the relationship between the person served and her family, and addresses the person's need for the support of her family and informal social network is implemented.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Counseling: Individual, Group, and Family counseling is provided once a week at the residential home with oversight provided by a LCSW. Treatment Coordination; assists the resident, family and social worker in developing goals that promote healthy social, emotional, physical, educational, mental, and spiritual development in the teen mother's and their children. Developmentally Appropriate Childcare Center; Provided on site. This childcare center provides activities that promote the healthy development of the infant and assist the mother's in learning appropriate skills. Special Classes Available on Site: Independent Living Skills, Parenting Education and Child, Substance Abuse Education, Development, and Childbirth Education. Educational opportunities; pre and post secondary educational opportunities with the local school system and community colleges. Medical Services: AGC arranges for the services and sees that follow up services are addressed in a timely manner.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

AGC will be staffed with sufficient professional and direct care personnel to assure excellent care and treatment for our residents. It is recognized that residents' needs may require an increased staff-to-resident ratio. AGC is dedicated to ethically operating in compliance with licensure requirements, and to provide quality care to the residents of AGC. AGC's residential programs provide 24-hour monitoring by trained staff under the supervision of the Director of Residential Services. For Residential Treatment, AGC operates on a 5/1 staff-to-resident ratio. There must be one staff on campus for every 5 residents who are present. On the overnight shift, there must be one awake staff person on campus for every 8 residents. Targeted Treatment Coordinators or designee is available for 24-hour emergency response, and maintains appropriate contact with clientele in order to ensure continuity of care and ethical provision of services.
