Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff

Brooklawn has two licensed child psychiatrists on staff. The psychiatrists are on campus approximately ten hours a week, during which time they participate in treatment team meetings and conduct medication management appointments. The Medical Director also participates in monthly quality improvement and utilization review meetings. Both psychiatrists are on call 24 hours a day. The staff at Brooklawn includes four full time nurses, who conduct health screenings, manage all resident health needs, and coordinate efforts in infection control and universal precautions. There is a nurse present or on call at all times.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Brooklawn actively works to involve families in the treatment planning process by involving them in treatment planning and offering family therapy sessions on a flexible schedule that includes nights and weekends. Brooklawn also offers transportation assistance in the form of gas card vouchers. Families who are having financial difficulties or who travel a great distance can receive gas cards to promote their participation in family therapy sessions. Brooklawn also provides weekly visitation three days a week. Families are involved in any significant incidents that occur with their child through a notification and debriefing process. Each child at Brooklawn is also actively working on a life book that promotes and/or supports their connections to their families.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Crisis Consultant: 7 days a week, during waking hours, by a licensed clinician designated to assist with crisis intervention and clinical issues. Specialized treatment for Sexually Reactive Youth. Programming for Substance Abuse Issues. School Social Work Services: provided by a certified school social worker. Psychological Testing. Therapeutic Child Support Services: This is a service that can be provided post discharge as well. Mentors and Tutors. Independent Living Training. Auto Mechanics Vocational Training: Available on campus through JCPS. Horticulture Program: Educational and job skills training components.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Yes, extra staff are placed in cottages that serve children with more acute needs. In addition to the staff required to comply with licensing regulations, there are also between 2 and 7 residential supervisors present during each first and second shift.
