Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff

Dr. Michael McIntosh meets with each resident and his therapist one time per month for psychiatric consultation. He is available on a 24 hour basis for emergencies and consultation. The Home employs two full time LPNs. They are also available via an on-call system during off hours. All direct care staff are trained in CPR, First Aid, Blood Borne Pathogens, medication administration. Medical care is provided by local providers.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The Children's Home is extremely committed to working with families. To facilitate permanency plans, The Children's Home provides family therapy, liberal but scheduled visitation and phone calls. All parents are invited to treatment team meetings and special events on campus with limited transportation available. The Children's Home's definition of family is very liberal, and residents are eligible to receive family services.

Special Interventions Available Internally

The Children's Home Burlington campus is located on 59 acres. The remote locality of the campus is ideal for children with a history of AWOL behaviors. The Children's Home Burlington campus provides an ongoing substance abuse Seeking Safety Group for those residents who have been identified as having a history of substance abuse or misuse. All other residents receive an six week course designed to educate them on the dangers of using drugs.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Staffing Ratio is at 5:1 during awake hours and 10:1 during sleeping hours. The therapist has a caseload of 14.
