These services are overseen by Dr. Ed Connor. He meets twice monthly with the clinical staff to review the residents, in addition to providing staff training. The Clinical staff is trained in the JSOCCP in addition to Trauma Focused-CBT. Some children CHNK specific classrooms at a local alternative school.

Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff

Dr. Michael McIntosh meets with each resident and his therapist one time per month for psychiatric consultation. He is available on a 24 hour basis for emergencies and consultation. The Home employs two full time LPNs. They are also available via an on-call system during off hours. All direct care staff are trained in CPR, First Aid, Blood Borne Pathogens, medication administration. Medical care is provided by local providers.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The Children's Home is extremely committed to working with families. To facilitate permanency The Children's Home provides family therapy, liberal but scheduled visitation and phone calls. All parents are invited to treatment team meetings and special events on campus with limited transportation available. The Children's Home's definition of family is very liberal, and residents are eligible to receive family services.

Special Interventions Available Internally

There are Master level therapists available 24 hours per day. Direct Care staff are trained in multiple de-escalation techniques. The Children's Home Covington campus provides services for children with sexual behavioral issues. Specialized individual and group therapies are utilized to address this issue.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

There is a 5:1 staff ratio pattern during awake hours and 10:1 during sleeping hours. The therapists carry a caseload of 12.
