CYS encourages, family involvement and becomes involved offering counseling; transportation, assistance, i.e. family in need of clothing after a fire, etc. CYS has an active treatment team that consults daily to ensure each resident is offered unique and customized treatment which is documented on Individual Treatment Plans, on a daily tasks and daily objectives. The treatment team pursues "out of the box" thinking to help the resident to be able to stay at CYS until his/her goals are met.
