Supplemental Information

Bloom Where you are Planted is based on the Sanctuary Model, an evidence-based, holistic approach for traumatized youth in residential settings. The treatment team designs individualized plans to guide residents as they all work through the phases of establishing safety, regulating feelings, working through losses and building a future. Residents are offered psycho educational classes daily: parenting, empowerment, nutrition, art/writing, exercise, conflict resolution, independent living skills, cultural awareness, substance abuse prevention and childbirth education for pregnant residents. FCH garden is being cared for in part by residents and produce is used in nutrition and cooking classes. Case managers work with families to partner regarding permanency plans, teachers to facilitate academic progress and other providers to ensure resident's needs are met. FCH provides scrapbook for each resident and instructions/ time to create and maintain Lifebooks and baby books.

Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff

Therapist coordinates psychiatric care with Dr. Fernandez, MD, PSC, licensed child and adolescent psychiatrist through his private clinical practice. All residents are seen for an initial psychiatric evaluation within the first month of care and follow up appointments are scheduled for ongoing psychiatric care and/or medication monitoring minimum monthly. FCH employs a full time RN case manager to assess and manage chronic and acute needs of residents and their infants. RN provides medication management and education for all residents. RN coordinates medical, dental, and visual care with other providers, schedules all appointments, monitors day to day physical health and needs, and is available for consultations by phone during non-working hours and in case of emergency.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Therapist offers family therapy to families where the goal is reunification. If family can not come due to transportation teleconference is available. Families who are supportive of treatment are invited to all quarterly treatment meetings/reviews. Residents have five phone times per week when they are allowed to make up to fifteen minute phone calls. Residents are allowed to write letters to family members and have visits on weekends on-grounds or off -grounds when the resident on the correct level.

Special Interventions Available Internally

FCH specializes in serving pregnant and parenting teens. All staff is trained to support and help residents during pregnancy and if they chose to parent after the baby is born. Full time RN teaches childbirth preparation and infant care at school and one on one. Residents meet together for parenting support group and attend parenting classes at school with other teen parents. Pregnant and parenting residents are encouraged to participate in the HANDS Home Network program and individual workers come to meet with them weekly. For adolescents who are recovering from chemical dependency, individual counseling and AA/NA or Al-anon support groups are incorporated into the treatment plan and residents can work through the 12 step program or a comparable alternative. FCH residents may also have the opportunity to attend Hospice programming or support groups if it is needed.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Program regularly exceeds staff to client ratio during the day due to on site school and having four full time treatment team members.
