Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The birth family is engaged from the beginning in efforts for them to understand the impact of separation and loss on their child, the child's need for permanence and to work in order to reunify their family. If the goal is reunification, Holly Hill Children's Services Therapeutic Foster Care will assist in: creating a positive environment in the foster home which maintains connections with the biological parents; supports the biological parents' ability to care for the child; proactively responds to challenges and conflicts associated with placement. Biological Parents will be encouraged to attend family counseling and all treatment planning sessions.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Active Involvement of an In-House Clinician as of 1/06: 24 hour availability of Crisis Intervention Services: Bi-annual Supervision with Foster Parents by Treatment Director, Specialize in providing interventions for loss and grief, attachment, child sexual abuse, self-efficacy, and behavioral self-control.
