Hope Hill's treatment foster care program supports family reunification by encouraging families to become involved in the treatment planning process and through individual and family therapy. When needed family therapy is offered after hours and on weekends. Hope Hill's treatment foster care program facilitates regular communication between youth and family members, and assists with transportation of youth to their homes for home visits.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Hope Hill treatment foster care program provides services for youth with a wide variety of issues and needs including youth with sexual and physical abuse and neglect histories. Services consist of individual and family counseling as well as psychiatric services.
