In addition to weekly to bi-weekly interaction with the children and families we serve, the case managers and treatment director are available twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week to provide crisis services or support. Through compassion, respect and skillful intervention, we can make a positive difference in the life of each child we serve.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Kentucky SAFE Louisville actively works to involve families in the treatment planning process by involving them in treatment team meetings, participation in family therapy when appropriate. Family visitation sessions are established for the children who have reunification as a goal or sibling visitation, Kentucky SAFE facilitates transportation for the children in our care, if it is difficult for the family to maintain the visitation.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Kentucky SAFE Louisville Case Managers and Treatment Director are available to the foster families and foster child for crisis situations twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. The case manager is the first responder, followed by the Treatment Director to act in a supervisory or support role, or to provide therapeutic crisis intervention as needed. The Executive Director is also available for consultation if a situation should require additional administrative intervention. Specific interventions for each child are written in his or her treatment plan and are reviewed and revised as necessary.
