Special Interventions Available Internally

Case management is available to all children in the program. There is 24 hour clinical on call coverage. Psychological evaluations and chemical dependency assessments are available through referrals to the outpatient clinic. Chemical dependency treatment including individual therapy, IOP and after care groups are also available through the outpatient clinics. School therapists, who are contracted through the school system, are available to children with targeted school behaviors. Groups are conducted in the group home on a weekly basis by members of the clinical staff.
