The program has specialized dorm settings for those with chemical dependency issues, those who have sexual behavior problems, those whose primary treatment concern is aggression and those who are lower functioning. Clients attend school on-site. All clients are assigned a Masters level Treatment Coordinator and a Masters level therapist. In June, 2007 the program fully implemented a trauma informed care approach, Risking Connection. Lastly, the program has fully implemented the Seven Challenges model for substance abuse treatment.

Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff

Maryhurst has a contract with Seven Counties Services for psychiatric services. The psychiatrist sees clients on our main campus twice per week and is on call for assistance throughout the week. The Euphrasia clients all have a psychiatric evaluation after placement and see the psychiatrist on a regular basis as needed for follow-up. Maryhurst has a contract with U of L. medical school for Dr. Monique Howard and residents to provide twice weekly medical care on-site. Maryhurst also employs a full-time RN and LPN, as well as support aides, who provide on-going medical services for clients.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Family therapy is provided internally, at times through speaker phone if the family does not have the resources to come on-site. Families are involved in treatment planning. Staff assist with transportation to visits as needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

The program has available occupational therapy services for those who need them. The program routinely is offering music and art therapy, as well as life-skills training and wellness/activity programming. Several dorm therapists are trained in SOTP therapy. The Euphrasia staff have been trained and have fully implemented the Seven Challenges approach to substance abuse treatment. The Des Anges dorm is equipped to serve lower functioning youth.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Yes. The Des Anges dorm typically runs at 1 staff to 3 clients. The other dorms are staffed at no higher than 1 to 5, and most often at 1 to 4.
