Rosehaven has an Maryhurst therapist who sees all clients for individual, group and family therapy as indicated. Each client is assigned a bachelors level treatment team coordinator. Maryhurst staff have fully implemented the Seven Challenges curriculum for substance abuse. The program has been designed around the need to teach pre-independent living skills. Youth are trained in using community resources, such as public transportation, libraries etc. Access to campus school as needed.

**Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff**

Maryhurst has a contract for psychiatric service through a contract with Seven Counties Services for 20 hours per week. The psychiatrist sees clients on our main campus twice per week and is on call for assistance throughout the week. The Rosehaven clients all have a psychiatric evaluation after placement and see the psychiatrist on a regular basis as needed for follow-up. Maryhurst has a contract with U. of L. medical school for Dr. Lisa Howard and residents to provide a twice weekly clinic on the Dorsey Lane site. We also employ a RN and a LPN who are available on-call for Rosehaven clients.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Rosehaven staff assist with transportation to family visits as needed. Families are involved in treatment planning and are encouraged to visit on-site. Treatment Team Coordinator works closely with families in arranging home passes, visits, contact, etc.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

The program staff have been trained and utilize the Seven Challenges approach for substance abuse treatment. A CADIC provides weekly group therapy and individual therapy on site for those with CD issues. Clients attend community AA/NA meetings. Clients attend public school, but an educational liaison works with all public schools to ensure client success. Rosehaven staff are also able to help youth gain the necessary pre-independent living skills that are needed as they approach independence.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Yes. The program runs at 3 staff for 10 clients while awake and 2 staff for 10 clients while the clients are asleep.
