The staff at NECCO of Paducah has a wealth of experience working with youth that have high risk behaviors and severe emotional problems. Included among the staff are licensed social workers, certified social work counselor, juvenile sex offender counselors, and staff who hold master level degrees in psychology, marriage and family therapy, and social work. NECCO of Paducah provides 24 hour crisis intervention, mental health evaluations, individual and family counseling offered on site and in the home, intensive case management services, and on-going foster parent training. Staff coordinates collaboration for academic, medical, vocational, family involvement, and treatment purposes. Our staff can conduct intakes at locations convenient for the placing agency. NECCO can also provide theft prevention classes, PRI classes, and random drug screens. This office has elected not to utilize Safe Crisis Management (SCM) restraint techniques.

NECCO of Paducah sends invitations to treatment plan meetings to biological family members that remain involved with the youth we serve. Contact with family members via phone or face to face visits are encouraged and supported. Service/treatment plan goals are developed to facilitate the youth's current and aftercare needs. Family counseling is available for biological family and youth to assist permanency goal.
