Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Transition therapy is conducted with youth, biological parent, and adoptive parent or those identified as the permanency goal for the youth. During transition therapy sessions the family is assessed for risk factors and needs to determine the most appropriate after-care plans. Based upon the assessment of risk and needs and treatment team recommendation, NBFS may request a 2 week bed hold so as to provide after-care services which may include but are not limited to transitional therapy (until linkage with a local community mental health provider), proper weekly case management services, via phone or face-to-face contact with family or identified permanency goal and continued psychiatric services. These after-care services will be provided for a minimum of 2 weeks to a maximum of 30 days depending on the risk and needs of the family as assessed by the therapist/treatment team and upon the stabilization of the placement.

Special Interventions Available Internally

24 hour, 7 day a week crisis intervention. Consisting of therapists providing phone crisis intervention and/or face-to-face intervention. Psychiatric recommendation for possible hospital placement pending third party assessment of needs.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Our program does not exceed the maximum of 20 clients per case worker.
