Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Our families and staff work with DCBS and the biological family to help children return to their families. Every foster family is trained to know many of the children in their care will return to their biological families. Our goal is permanency whether with biological family or a foster to adopt family.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Omni Visions provides case management services bi-monthly visits to the foster home (more often if dictated by the needs of the client), arranging for medical, vision and developmental screenings, attending educational meetings and therapeutic interventions/supports to the foster family. Family counseling can include sessions with biological parents if approved by DCBS. Extra benefits to clients and families include financial help for transportation reimbursement, addition respite in crisis situations, school functions, extracurricular activities, summer activities for clients that include various camps, free tickets for fun days at water parks for all foster families and their clients, extra monies at Christmas beyond what DCBS pays, free dinners for foster parents with Omni Visions staff in the fall of each year, Evidenced Based training for all foster parents and a willingness to help with additional transportation needs beyond what is expected by DCBS.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Our goal is to have one Resource Coordinator for every 8 Treatment leveled clients. The State regulations allow 12 Treatment clients per worker.
