Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Omni Visions case managers ensure foster children make contact with their biological parents by arranging and providing transportation for them to visit their families. In addition, case managers invite biological parents to their children's treatment meetings and biological parents are given copies of their children's monthly reports, discharge reports, and any incident report that may occur. Moreover, Omni Visions will begin facilitating family counseling to foster children and their biological families as determined by the treatment team. Lastly, Omni Visions ensures the foster child's rights are respected in regards to sending and receiving mail and making and receiving phone calls with their biological families.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Omni Visions provides case management services which include weekly or bi-monthly visits to the foster homes, arranging for medical, vision, and developmental screenings, attending educational meetings, and therapeutic interventions/supports to foster family. Omni Visions advocates for individual and family counseling and assists in accessing such services. Family counseling can include sessions with biological parents. In addition, Omni Visions provides two days of paid respite a month and 24 hour on call services. Lastly, Omni Visions provides extras to the foster families to help financially with the foster child's expenses. These extras include transportation reimbursement to all appointments, school functions, and visits with biological families, paying half of extracurricular activities up to \$50.00 a month, option to bank 8 days of paid respite, financial help in paying for camps, clothes, senior pictures, class rings, etc. (beyond state reimbursement).
