Every other Sunday visitation. Family therapy available. Last phase of program youth is taken back into the community by staff in order to apply for jobs, find housing, enroll in college if appropriate. Family phone calls, letters and regular contact with counselors are encouraged for family participation.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Specialty groups other than weekly provided various topic groups: Depression group, Body Image and self esteem group, weekly Substance abuse groups led by a CADC.

Yes, currently staff to child ratio exceeds minimum standards. Currently, ratio is 1 staff for 5 residents.
