REACH treatment consists of doctoral level psychologists, who hold current Ky. Board of Psychology licenses. In addition, treatment staff are highly experienced (on average 18 years). Families have access to several layers of support. This includes 24/7 access to their REACH psychologist, 24/7 access to specially trained (CPI and SCM certified) Crisis Management Team, and access to the REACH Family Support Network groups. All foster families are provided with the phone numbers of all Clinical Coordinators, the Clinical and Executive Directors. In addition, each family receives an individualized refrigerator magnet (for immediate access) that includes critical crisis information and phone numbers. REACH provides each school with access to Crisis Managers and support services and consult with school personnel to coordinate school placements. REACH also is an approved SCL provider, and provides adult foster care and day programming for our youth who age out and qualify for an SCL waiver.
