SAFY makes monthly contacts with bio families. They are included in treatment plans and school meetings. SAFY facilitates/coordinates family home visits. SAFY coordinates contact between foster and primary family to talk about what works with youth (their strengths, behavior management interventions, etc). SAFY provides bio families with advocacy and linkage to community resources in home areas.
