Supplemental Information

AMRFC office was created in September 2008 and serves Bell, Brethitt, Clay, Harlan, Jackson, Knott, Knox, Leslie, Letcher, Owsley and Perry counties. Sunrise Children's Services provides all foster parents specialized de-escalation techniques from the Boy's Town training model. These techniques have proven effective for children of most ages and cognitive functioning levels as well as for children who display a variety of behavioral or mental health issues. 100% of AMRFC staff have college education. 80% of staff have a BA or above. AMRFC veteran foster parents average more than two years of providing foster care services for Sunrise. Quarterly support group meetings are provided for our foster parents. Foster parents are required to obtain 24 hours of yearly training. Since March of 08, Sunrise foster parents have adopted 103 DCBS foster children meaning 103 DCBS children have found a forever family through our Sunrise Foster Care program.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Foster parents usually transport clients to family visits but staff can transport, if needed. Biological family is invited to participate in treatment planning. Family counseling is available if requested by DCBS. Foster care staff can observe supervised visitation, if needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Staff is on call twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Foster care specialists, director, and therapist all carry pagers that foster parents and/or DCBS staff can call in case of an emergency. AMRFC has one full-time therapist, who along with the director is in the process of obtaining certification as a Juvenile Sexual Offender Counselor. AMRFC has the ability to directly refer clients to Sunrise residential and crisis facilities.
