Dixon Center utilizes a trauma recovery model that focuses on the underlying attachment issues that contribute to most adolescent emotional and behavioral needs, while also providing a home-like environment. All staff are highly trained and work toward building supportive, trusting relationships to promote recovery. Individual and group therapy, education and healthy recreational activities encourage youth to make positive attachments and develop necessary skills for a successful future. Dixon Center staff work closely with the child, their family as well as social workers, teachers and medical professionals to provide a comprehensive treatment team approach to healing. Specialization success includes pregnant or parenting teens and helping youth regain school credits, or gain their GED. For youth that are not able to reunite with their family, Sunrise's continuum of care provides opportunity for youth to step down to less restrictive placement options that support the reinforce the treatment modalities and behavior management skills gained at Dixon. Youth who have graduated high school are excluded from admission.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The Dixon Center facilitates family connections when the permanency plan is reunification through family sessions, weekly written and telephone correspondence, encouragement of family involvement in treatment planning and assessment, and through the coordination of home visits and day passes.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Dixon provides drug and alcohol treatment by using "The Seven Challenges" Model and conducts SASSI (Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory) assessments on all new admissions. Credit Recovery Services are available through the Webster County Alternative School System for clients who are significantly behind in academics. GED services are also available. Family counseling is offered as well as group therapy. Psycho educational groups are conducted on a weekly basis focusing on subjects to include Anger Management, Social Skills and Independent Living Skills. A variety of recreational, spiritual and cultural activities are offered within the program as well as community events where clients are encouraged to use their social skills to interact. The program utilizes a 5 tier phase system that encourages good citizenship and responsibility in order for advancement. The phase system can be easily modified for clients who have difficulty working through phase level tasks.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

Yes. Two staff are scheduled nightly during sleeping hours. This exceeds the staff to child ratio of 1:12 during asleep hours
