In SFY 08, Sunrise's Eastern Region Foster Care (ERFC) - scored above average in the areas of Service Delivery, when compared to other private foster care programs by the Children's Review Program. Sunrise Children's Services provides all foster parents specialized de-escalation techniques from the Boy's Town training model. These techniques have proven effective for children of most ages and cognitive functioning levels as well as for children who display a variety of behavioral or mental health issues. 60% of ERFC staff either have a Masters Degree or 30 plus years experience in social work. 53% of ERFC's foster parents have 3-5 years of fostering experience with Sunrise, and 70% of foster parents have 3- 11 years of fostering experience with Sunrise. Staff support is available to foster parents 24/7. Since March of 08, Sunrise foster parents have adopted 103 DCBS foster children meaning 103 DCBS children have found a forever family through our Sunrise Foster Care program.

Staff give 24/7 support to foster families. The program has 2 therapists on staff, one of which is a Juvenile Sexual Offender Counselor. The program director is in the process of obtaining this certification as well.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

ERFC regularly exceeds the minimum staff/client ratios. ERFC maintains the staff/therapeutic client caseload licensure requirement even though all children are not therapeutic.
