Sunrise's Genesis Center provides residential treatment and therapeutic services that include treatment for runaway behaviors, including impulse-based and self-harming behaviors, as well as oppositional defiant disorder, depression and emotional, physical and sexual abuse. In SFY 08, Genesis attained above average scores in the areas of Treatment Planning and Service Delivery, when compared to other private residential treatment programs evaluated by the Children's Review Program. Genesis provides an on-campus school under the direction of the Graves County Public School District. For youth that are not able to reunite with their family, Sunrise's continuum of care provides opportunity for youth to step down to less restrictive placement options that support and reinforce the treatment modalities and behavior management skills gained at Genesis.

Individual, group and milieu therapy, as well as psycho educational groups on anger management, conflict resolution, substance abuse relapse prevention, and independent living are offered on-campus. The Seven Challenges program is used to assist youth, which come from a background that includes alcohol and substance abuse, to make a commitment to minimize the impact that drugs and alcohol has had in their lives. A variety of recreational, spiritual and cultural activities are offered within the program as well as off campus events throughout the community in which clients are encouraged to use their social skills to interact within the community setting.
