The Metro Region Foster Care office has been in operation for 15 years. Sunrise Children's Services provides all foster parents specialized de-escalation techniques from the Boy's Town training model. These techniques have proven effective for children of most ages and cognitive functioning levels as well as for children who display a variety of behavioral or mental health issues. 100% of MRFC staff have a BA or above. MRFC veteran foster parents average more than two years of providing foster care services for Sunrise. On-going support group meetings are provided for our foster parents. Foster parents are required to obtain 24 hours of yearly training. Since March of 08, Sunrise foster parents have adopted 103 DCBS foster children meaning 103 DCBS children have found a forever family through our Sunrise Foster Care program. Staff is on call twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. After hours placements are accepted. MRFC has the ability to directly refer clients to Sunrise residential and crisis facilities. MRFC contracts with private providers in the community for therapy.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Foster parents usually transport clients to family visits but staff can transport, if needed. Biological family is invited to participate in treatment planning. Family counseling is available if requested by DCBS. Foster care staff can observe supervised visitation, if needed.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Staff is on call twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Foster care specialists, director, and therapist all carry cell phones that foster parents and/or DCBS staff can call in case of an emergency. DCBS can utilize cell phones for after-hours placement. MRFC has the ability to directly refer clients to Sunrise residential and crisis facilities.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

MRFC regularly exceeds the minimum staff/client ratios. MRFC maintains the staff/therapeutic client caseload licensure requirement even though all children are not therapeutic.
