Sunrise's Morehead Treatment Center is a locked facility providing residential treatment services, which includes individual, family, and group therapy, substance abuse counseling, life skills training and other psycho educational and social skills groups and activities. In SFY 08, Morehead attained an above average score in Service Delivery when compared to other private residential treatment programs evaluated by the Children's Review Program. Morehead provides an on-campus school under the direction of the Rowan County Public School District. Youth benefit from the educational, recreational and cultural opportunities available on campus and in the community. For youth that are not able to reunite with their family, Sunrise's continuum of care provides opportunity for youth to step down to less restrictive placement options that support and reinforce the treatment modalities and behavior management skills gained at Morehead.

Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

The program encourages communication with the families and family counseling is offered. Families are also invited to and encouraged to participate in treatment planning and all aspects of their child's treatment.

Special Interventions Available Internally

Morehead Center utilizes a trauma recovery model using Risking Connection which focuses on the underlying attachment issues that contribute to most adolescent emotional and behavioral needs. All staff are highly trained and work toward building supportive, trusting relationships which promote recovery. We provide a wide range of therapeutic groups, education, and healthy recreational activities which encourage youth to make positive attachments and develop necessary skills. With Sunrise's continuum of care, we are able to provide comprehensive discharge planning including the option of Sunrise foster care. We are diligent in providing social workers with timely information on the progress of their youth. Therapeutic services include treatment for a variety of emotional, mental health, behavioral, substance abuse, and daily living skills needs.
