All staff are available to Therapeutic Foster Parents 24/7/365. All case management staff are Masters level clinicians. The Program Therapist and Director are both independently licensed clinicians. Since March 2008, Sunrise foster parents have adopted 103 DCBS foster children meaning 103 DCBS children have found a forever family through our Sunrise Foster Care program.

**Psychiatric Consultation and Internal Medical Staff**

SCFC maintains great relationships with several psychiatrists in our region. Two local psychiatrists are currently contracted through Sunrise for psychiatric consult, support and training to our foster families, medication management, etc. The program is surrounded by 3 local psychiatric hospitals that staff have worked closely with for many years. Staff and foster parents are involved in the client's treatment team and family sessions through the hospital during a client's stay, in order to transition the client to the appropriate environment upon discharge, whether that be back to the foster home or to a residential treatment facility. The agency also has access to a Medical Staff of Nurses employed by our residential facilities for consult, questions from foster parents, and medical guidance on a 24/7 basis.

SCFC foster parents and staff are available to transport children to birth family visits w/o assistance from DCBS staff. Our foster parents and staff are very conscientious, and will follow visitation schedules and provide this service as needed. Family sessions are provided by our program therapist when requested by DCBS in order to ensure a transition back to the biological home. Foster care staff are available to aid in the supervision of supervised visits required by DCBS between clients and bio family members.
