In SFY 08, Sunrise Children's Services Southern Region Foster Care (SRFC) - Danville Program scored above average in the areas of Treatment Planning and Service Delivery, when compared to other private foster care programs by the Children's Review Program. Sunrise Children's Services provides all foster parents specialized de-escalation techniques from the Boy's Town training model. These techniques have proven effective for children of most ages and cognitive functioning levels as well as for children who display a variety of behavioral or mental health issues. Since March of 08, Sunrise foster parents have adopted 103 DCBS foster children meaning 103 DCBS children have found a forever family through our Sunrise Foster Care program. SRFC - Danville has an experienced staff consisting of a Program Director, Program Therapist, 3 Foster Care Specialists and Clerical Assistant. Staff carry a caseload of 10-12 cases and have both Masters and Bachelors degrees. Many of the current foster parents have fostered for more than 10 years and are still dedicated, desiring to make a difference in a child's life. Many of the foster families indicate the main reason they continue to foster for Sunrise Children's Services is the fact they receive support and know they can call 24/7.

## Describe How the Program Supports Family Connections

Sunrise Woodlawn is committed to providing children and their parents every opportunity for a successful reunification. This includes in-house family therapy, transportation to and from visits, family visitation, supervision and phone contact facilitation. All program staff work with the court system to ensure that the needs of children and families are met while moving through the reunification process.

## Special Interventions Available Internally

24 Hour Crisis on Call. Sanders Center Crisis Unit provides immediate short term placement in lieu of hospitalization. Foster to adopt services internally which allows for continuity of services between foster care and adoption at Woodlawn.

Description of how the program exceeds licensure ratios

SRFC Danville regularly exceeds the minimum staff/client ratios. SRFC Danville maintains the staff/therapeutic client caseload licensure requirement even though all children are not therapeutic.
